**Liturgical Guidance for Mass Attendance**

Masses have resumed here at St. Bernadette on a limited basis. Per Bishop Wack, we will follow these guidelines:

- All must be in good health and free of symptoms.
- All must wear a mask.
- All must maintain a 6 foot social distance.
- Only members of your household may sit together.

*(Dispensation of the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday will continue, since it will not be possible for everyone to attend on Sundays. If a person is sick, or is vulnerable to infection, or if they live with or care for someone who is vulnerable, they should stay home.)*

Other measures that will be taken to insure the safety of those attending Mass:

- Hymnals, envelopes, all loose items will be removed from pews.
- Collection baskets will be placed in a common location, not passed around.
- Communion to be taken by hand only.
- No Precious Blood will be distributed.
- Communion procession will be spaced six feet apart.
- Other safety procedures as necessary to be instituted as needed.
